Minister's Message

Imua-Let's start again.

Aloha,

"Have you ever found yourself stuck in the middle of the sea?" This sentence describes someone who is going through struggles about family issues, human relationships, health issues, financial issues, etc. They feel they are adrift and don't know what to do. In that situation, what kind of help do you think we can offer or do you want to receive? Some may say we sail a boat to find and save you and the other may say we will provide a lighthouse so that people can know where they should

swim to. Or "if you ever find yourself lost in the dark and you can't see", what kind of help do you seek? Do you want to have a bright like a lighthouse which shows the way to go? Or do you want to have somebody who is with you holding a candle light and walking with you?

This teaches us two different directions. The first is the guidance from the destination which shows the way how to get there. It is far from you, it is not with you, but it offers where to go and which path we should take. The other is the guidance which is with you and walk together to the destination like a caravan who knows where to go in the desert. Which guidance do you prefer to have in your life?

The chanting of Vandana & Ti-Sarana says; I go to the Buddha for guidance. I go to the Dharma for guidance. I go to the Sangha for guidance. When we chant this sutra, this signifies the guidance from the Buddha for me & you. Buddha is calling and asking us to take refuge in the three treasures from the other shore of the Pure Land. And when we receive the teachings in our life, it becomes our guidance which leads us to live life to the enlightenment to come. So, true guidance always shows the destination and the warmth of being together with us. It is like a child who got lost. When the child is at a loss and doesn't know where to go and what to do, they have only worries and concerns. But if there is a person who notices the child and offers a helping hand, how does the child feel? The warm hands, gentle smile, kind words and the presence of someone who understands the feeling and loneliness of the child will guide her/him to find comfort in spite of the fact of getting lost. The reality and the fact of getting lost doesn't change, but the child is no longer alone. There is somebody who thinks of the child and guides them to find the place where they should belong to. They don't tell the child to go and find a place but they walk together and share the sorrows of life together.

Amida Buddha is enshrined in the altar as an object of reverence. We bow our heads, offer flowers & incense, chant sutras, and show our respects. However, Amida Buddha's dynamic working is not limited to the altar but it reaches out to us and always with us calling "I will share a life of joy and sorrow with others." Amida Buddha's unconditional compassion is embracing every single person whatever happens in their lives – I am not alone. And Amida Buddha's Transcendent Wisdom reveals the way of life I'm living and guides us to live life to the fullest not driven by our human judgmental & distinctive mind but by true and real wisdom – I know where to go. Amida Buddha exists for me like a lighthouse who shines upon the path I shall walk. And Amida Buddha is with me, understanding my joy and sorrow and walking with me and starting again with me.

We revere the Master Shinran Shonin as our founder and our teacher. But, Shinran Shonin calls me and you as "Ondobo & Ondogyo, you are my dharma friends who are going through the struggles of life and who are embraced by Amida Buddha". We are indeed lonely. No one can exactly know your feelings and struggle and

no one can take your place. However, indeed we are never alone when we realize the unconditional Compassion of Amida Buddha which embraces every single person no matter what. Together, we are embraced. Let us walk together and let us start again. We are not perfect, we are angry, we are sad, we are upsetting, we are complaining, we are laughing, we are smiling, we are helping, we are sharing, and we are living. We are perfectly imperfect, therefore we need each other as dharma friends who follow and practice the teachings of Buddhism. Imua, Let us start again and move forward as we are knowing that Amida Buddha's Compassion is always with us and Amida Buddha's Wisdom shows the path we shall take. Namo Amida Butsu.

- R & M Committee met and has plans to meet again; one area of concern is the columbarium gutters
- Columbarium Improvement Committee will have a meeting soon

Approved Activities/Announcements

- Rev. Tomioka thanked affiliates and members for support and financial donations to improve his online services and activities. However, existing equipment is still being used and there are and will continue to be problems. He said there is need to continue to upgrade and update equipment. Expenditures exceeded donations.
- The founder of Shin Buddhism, Master Shinran Shonin, was born on May 21, 1173 in Japan. Without Master Shinran, we would not be able to listen to the teachings of Nembutsu which promises to embrace us all and emancipate us from struggles in this world of human beings. Let us observe Gotan-e Service (Founder's Birthday) online on May 16.
- As people are vaccinated, various restrictions are gradually lifted and adjusted, however, there are still risks. We need to follow and practice all of the CDC guidelines. If you come to temple, please be mindful of your actions wear a mask, social distance, good hygiene, etc. Your actions have more impact than you think.
- April Activities included Easter drive-by: 300 bags were made and nine of them had a golden egg.
 People were able to walk into the temple, offer incense, and pour sweet tea on baby Buddha for Hanamatsuri.
- 14th BWA State Membership Conference will be held on Maui on Apr. 23-24, 2022
- Carol Tsunezumi reported Mrs. Mieko Nagao, Mrs. Lei Kakugawa, and Mrs. Ilene Hara continue to sew face masks. Blankets are also being made.
- Investment Committee reports assets are allocated as follows: 30% in medium risk and 70% in higher risk assets.
- Project Dana reports bento deliveries will start on April 21: 4 meals to Keaau and 8 meals to Hilo.
 Project Dana Headquarters received a generous donation from Kahala Nui, a senior residential facility on Oahu. The money was designated to support the volunteers and clients during the pandemic. Both volunteers and clients received gift cards.
- Social Concern Funds will be used for the hot meal on Mother's Day.
- Six members who are or will be 80 in 2021 (Keirosha) will be honored at a later date.

- The Interfaith Memorial Day Service on May 29, Saturday, will be strictly an online event. Guest speaker will be Ms. Deb Lewis. Ministers have been contacted.
- Bon dance will be on July 10; service will be held at a different date. Four tents will be set up with 5 dancers in each tent; need to sign up; ½ hour intervals from 5:00-7:00 p.m. Pre-ordered bento will be available.
- Congratulations to Mr. Blayne Nakasone! Ministerial Training Education Committee recommended he receive the award. The Committee offers financial support to any member. See Rev. Tomioka for the application.

DRIVE-BY BON DANCE SATURDAY JULY 10, 2021 FROM 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.

We submitted our drive-by bon dance plan to the County Civil Defence for review and approval and have not heard back from them yet. As things are opening-up we are going to move forward with our planning. Please be understanding and flexible if we need to change our plans again.

FOOD: For the drive-by Bon Dance we will have **pre-order** plate lunches available. Clifford and his crew will be making spare rib plates and chicken hekka plates available for pick up during the drive-by. The cost will be \$10 per plate. We are taking orders from our members first and then we will open the orders to the general public. We will open the order to the public on Saturday, June 19, 2021 so get your order in before that date so that we will ensure we have your plate orders available.

DANCERS: We have submitted a plan to the County to get approval to do our drive-by event, but have not gotten a response yet. Hearing the news that restrictions may change in July we are going to continue to plan the event. We will set-up 4 dance tents that can accommodate five dancers per tent. To give people a chance to dance we will have ½ hour sign up slots starting from 5:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. Puna Hongwanji members will be given first priority. We will then open up the slots to the odori groups and other temples. If we don't fill all those slots then we will go to the general public.
